Secret Service Guards Kennedy

WASHINGTON (AP) — Secret Service agents are guarding Sen. Edward Kennedy, D-Mass., as he campaigns with Democratic presidential nominee George McGovern, Kennedy's office said today.

Agents were assigned to Kennedy on President Nixon's orders after the May 15 shooting of Gov. George C. Wallace of Alabama.

They were withdrawn at Kennedy's request June 5. However, Kennedy asked that agents be assigned to him again after Labor Day when he took up a heavy schedule of appearances, his office said.
