Judge Denies Inquest Into Kennedy

NEW BEDFORD, Mass. (AP)

—Chief Justice G. Joseph Tauro
of the state Superior Court remediately for comment on jected flatly today a request for whether he planned to transfer an inquest into the death of the request to District Court. Miss Mary Jo Kopechne.

Miss Kopechne, 28, was the secretary who drowned when Sen. Edward M. Kennedy's car, plunged off a bridge on Chap-paquiddick Island off the Mas-sachusetts coast July 18.

Tauro's secretary said the justice based his decision on the contention that jurisdiction in the matter rests with the District Court system, rather than the Superior Court.

The District Court is one step below the Superior Court in the makeup of the Massachusetts judicial system.

The inquest had been sought by Dist. Atty. Edmind Dinis.

Justice Tauro said last night that he first heard of the request from newsmen, and he described Dinis' announcement of the request as "bad judg-ment at the very least."

Tauro's decision today was

announced through his office in Boston.

Earlier today in Washington, Kennedy told newsmen that he would "cooperate in any way" possible with the request.

"It's still rather unclear as to the nature of it," Kennedy said.

"It's a legal matter," the sen-
