

## Postpone Hearing in Autopsy Bid

WILKES-BARRE, Pa. (AP)—  
A judge said today legal points raised by the attorneys for the parents of Mary Jo Kopechne made it necessary for Massachusetts Dist. Atty. Edmund Dinis to confer here prior to yesterday's scheduled hearing on his petition for an autopsy.

President Judge Bernard C. Brominski of Luzerne County Common Pleas Court said a motion on behalf of the parents, who are opposed to an autopsy, had been filed by attorneys Joseph F. Flanagan and John O'Connor, both of Wilkes-Barre.

He said he would meet here Thursday with Dinis.

Miss Kopechne drowned July 18 or 19 when an automobile driven by Sen. Edward M. Kennedy plunged off a narrow bridge on Chappaquidick Island off the Massachusetts coast.

Dinis, the New Bedford, Mass., prosecutor, wants her body exhumed for an autopsy that he considers vital to an inquest he has scheduled for Sept. 3.
