## Kennedy's Wife Is 'Feeling Good'

Senator Edward M. Kennedy said yesterday his wife, Joan, who lost the baby they were expecting in February in her third miscarriage, was "feeling good."

Kennedy, suntanned but obviously saddened by the latest personal loss in the tragedy-plagued Kennedy family, visited with his wife for about 45 minutes in Cape Cod Hospital.

Mrs. Kennedy, 32, was taken to the hospital Thursday night after being stricken while her husband and two of their three children were on

a camping trip on Nantucket Island.

She had planned to go along with them but canceled out upon feeling sick.

Kennedy, who rushed back to the mainland, arrived at the hospital about two hours after his wife awoke at 7 a.m. The hospital said she slept comfortably during the night.

Asked by newsmen whether the miscarriage was the result of a fall or accident, Kennedy said, "No — she just didn't carry." Joan, a slender blonde, previously miscarried in May 1963 and June 1964.
