**Kennedy Gets License
After Year's Revocation**

BOSTON, Feb. 8 (AP)— Senator Edward M. Kennedy, Democrat of Massachusetts has received a new driver's license to replace the one that was revoked for one year following an accident on Chappaquiddick Island in July, 1969, the Registry of Motor Vehicles reported today.

A Washington secretary drowned in Senator Kennedy's car when it went off a bridge into a tidal pool in the incident.

The Senator took the required tests at the Plymouth office of the Registry of Motor Vehicles last Nov. 27 and was given a license the same day, according to the Registrar, Richard E. McLaughlin.

A week after the accident, the Senator pleaded guilty to a charge of leaving the scene of an accident.

Judge James A. Boyle sentenced him to three months in jail, but suspended this and placed him on probation for one year. His license to drive was revoked for a mandatory one-year period.
