

VW Gets Magazine Recalled

A \$30 million suit brought by Volkswagen was settled yesterday when National Lampoon, a satirical magazine, agreed to recall 135,000 unsold copies of its latest issue, which contains an advertisement offensive to the auto manufacturer.

The suit was filed in Manhattan federal court last week by Volkswagen, which objected to a full-page mock advertisement depicting a Volkswagen floating in water and bearing the caption, "If Ted Kennedy drove a Volkswagen, he'd be president today."

A stipulation entered with the court provides for the destruction of the 135,000 copies and also an apology to be printed in the next issue of the magazine.
