Cox Is Named as Special Prosecutor Democrat Served Under Kennedy as Solicitor General

Former Solicitor General Archibald Cox, 61, agreed yesterday to serve as the Justice Department's special prosecutor in the Watergate scandals.

He was offered the major post of Solicitor General after it was turned down by his Harvard colleague, Paul A. Freund, which only enhanced the gratitude of the Kennedy brothers, President and Attorney General. ....
