[The investigation by Howard Hunt of Senator Edward Kennedy and the death of Mary Jo Kopechne, Colson] said, was Hunt's idea. He said that in July, 1971, one of Hunt's public relations associates got a telephone call from "someone in Massachusetts" with unpublished information about the drowning of Mary Jo Kopechne in Senator Kennedy's automobile on Chappaquiddick Island in August [sic - date was 18 Jul] 1969.

"Mr. Munt asked me if I would like to have him try to get that information and I said, 'Certainly,'" Mr. Colson testified.
