Kennedy Voices Doubt On'76 Presidential Bid

WASHINGTON, May 6 (UPI) — Senator Edward M. Kennedy, Democrat of Massachusetts, said Monday that "deep down" he would like to be President, but if he had to make a final decision now he would not run.

Mr. Kennedy said he would make his decision "sometime by late '75, possibly earlier" and added, "I think I have that degree of time in order to make any kind of a deci-sion on it."

Mr. Kennedy, the constant Mr. Kennedy, the constant front-runner among potential candidates for the Democratic Presidential nomination, was asked on the public broadcasting program "Washington Straight Talk" which way he was leaning at the moment.

"No, if I was asked today, I'd just run for re-election to the Senate," Mr. Kennedy said.
