WASHINGTON, Oct. 9—
Joan Kennedy, the wife of
Senator Edward M. Kennedy,
was arrested today and
charged with drunken driving
after her automobile was involved in a three-car accident
in Fairfax County, Va.

A Kennedy spokesman said
that no one was injured in
the accident, in which Mrs.
Kennedy's car rammed into
a car ahead, which in turn
was pushed into a third car.
The accident took place near
the Kennedy residence.

Mrs. Kennedy was arrested
by the Fairfax County police,
according to the spokesman,
and was charged with driving
while under the influence of
alcohol. She was taken to the
Fairfax County police headquarters and was subsequently released.

Senator Kennedy, who was
in the Senate at the time of
the accident, went home to
be with his wife.

Mrs. Kennedy in recent
months has undergone treatment in sanitariums in Connecticut and California, The
treatment was for what was
described as "emotional
stress."
