Are Charged to a Briton, 58

LONDON, Sept. 4 (AP)—A
man accused of demanding
\$3.4-million in a threat to kidnap Aristotle S. Onassis and
his-wife, Jacqueline, was also
charged today with threatening
to kill Mrs. Onassis.

The extra charge was disclosed as John W. Humphrys,
a 58-year-old electronics engineer, was remanded without
bail until a jury trial begins
next week. He was arrested
July 24.

In the preliminary hearing
he was accused of sending a
letter to John Newnham, a
shipping agent for Mr. Onassis,
in which there was a threat to
kill Mrs. Onassis, the widow of
President John F. Kennedy.
Further details were not disclosed.

At an earlier hearing he was closed.

At an earlier hearing he was accused of demanding \$3.4-million from Mr. Newnham to prevent the kidnapping of the Onassises.
