

AIDE OF MRS. ONASSIS DENIES BRIDAL PACT

WASHINGTON, Nov. 1 (UPI) —A spokesman for Mrs. Jacqueline Kennedy Onassis today described as "ridiculous" a report that a marriage contract exists between her and Aristotle Onassis, the Greek shipping magnate, that specifies separate bedrooms and an outlay of \$600,000 a year for her travel, pleasure, safety and children.

"That's ridiculous," said Mrs. Onassis' personal secretary, Nancy Tuckerman. "Honestly there's no such thing. It's really quite unfair and unkind. It's so fabricated."

Christian Kafarakis, de-

scribed as a former chief steward aboard Mr. Onassis' yacht, Christina, told of the alleged marriage contract in an interview that appeared in the London Sunday newspaper The People.

In his article, Mr. Kafarakis wrote that the contract, said to contain 170 clauses, was signed by the couple in New York three days before they were married in 1968 on the Isle of Skorpios.

According to Mr. Kafarakis, Mrs. Onassis stays in her apartment in New York and her husband rents permanently a suite on the top floor of the Pierre Hotel there.

"He doesn't have an apartment at the Pierre," said Miss Tuckerman. "There is no contract."
