**A SUSPECT GIVES UP  
IN KENNEDY ROBBERY**

A young unemployed man was arrested Thursday night and charged with stealing a bicycle and tennis racket from John F. Kennedy Jr., the 13-year-old son of the late President, in Central Park two months ago.

The suspect, 20-year-old Robert Lopez, who lives with his wife and their 2-month-old child at 2284 Second Avenue, surrendered at 8 P.M. at the East 102d Street police station, the police announced.

After questioning the suspect, the police recovered the stolen tennis racket and said they knew the whereabouts of the stolen bicycle and expected its recovery shortly.

The bicycle and tennis racket were stolen from young Kennedy the afternoon of May 14 on the East Drive at the 90th Street entrance to the park. He was on his way to a tennis lesson when the assailant grabbed the bike and racket and rode off into the park.

Mr. Lopez volunteered to turn himself in, according to Detective Richard Buggy of the investigations unit of the East 102d Street station, after the unit gained information on the theft that led to him. He was charged last night with robbery and possession of stolen property.
