supporters for their help in winning California's presidential
preference primary election.
Police captured a man Selieved to be the assailant. He
was about 25, curly haired, and clive skinned. They hustled
him out through the lobby of the Ambassador Hotel, a shotgun
at his back.

A doctor who said he treated Kennedy at the scene said

The turmoid and terror of the shooting was broadcast on
live television by cameras set up for the victory statement.
The shooting came as Kennedy won the California
Democratic primary over Senator Eugene J. McCarthy.
