Kathleen, who had been serving since 1945 as an American Red Cross worker in London, had married William John Robert Cavendish, the Marquess of Hartington, a captain in the Coldstream Guards. They had been married only four months when Cavendish was killed on an infantry patrol.

In May 1948, flying to Cannes to meet her father, Kathleen was killed when her chartered plane crashed into a peak bordering the Rhone Valley near Marseille, France. A peasant brought her body down from the hill in an ox cart.

There are three other female members of the Kennedy clan, all attractive, all prominent in their own right.

Patricia Kennedy was married to actor Peter Lawford and divorced last year. Eunice is married to Sargent Shriver, once director of the Peace Corps and until recently director of the Office of Economic Opportunity, now in France as U.S. ambassador. Jean is married to Stephen E. Smith, who handles many of the Kennedy family business interests, taking frequent leave to assist in political campaigns.

The family of Mrs. Robert Kennedy also has been struck by tragedy.

Joan Patricia Skakel, her widowed sister, died in May 1967 when a particle of meat lodged in her throat. Mrs. Skakel's husband Ethel's brother was killed in a plane crash in 1966.

Johnson-Kennedy add

"WASHN Johnson-Kennedy lead A085WX add: everywhere."

Presidential assistant Walt W. Kostow, on duty in the White House situation room, awakened Johnson at 3:31 a.m. EDT with a report of the shooting.

One of the President's first actions was to order the Secret Service to assign a protective detail to each major candidate, borrowing from other federal law enforcement agencies as needed.

Johnson conferred with Atty. Gen. Ramsey Clark, Secretary of Defense Clark M. Clifford and Director J. Edgar Hoover, of the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

He also spoke by telephone with Sen. Edward M. Kennedy, at the Good Samaritan Hospital in Los Angeles, and with two key members of the family political team, Theodore C. Sorensen and Stephen E. Smith, a Kennedy brother-in-law.

At Hyannis Port, Mass., a spokesman for the family of Joseph P. Kennedy said the former ambassador and his wife would be told of the shooting of their son when they awoke.

New Jersey Gov. Richard J. Hughes said in Princeton that the shooting provided "new evidence of the savage violence that is running through our society.

"We'd better wake up and take the guns away from the lunatics before they shoot all of us," he added.

Evangelist Billy Graham urged President Johnson to

"call the nation to prayer.

"I am terribly shocked and grieved not only for Sen. Kennedy and his family," Graham said in Montreat, N.C.,

"but for America. We're living through 1963 all over again."

"There are no words equal to the horror of this tragedy," the President said in a statement. "Our thoughts and our prayers are with Sen. Kennedy, his family and the other victims.

"All America prays for his recovery. We also pray that divisiveness and violence be driven from the hearts of men everywhere," President Johnson said.
