

Jackie Flying From N. Y. to L. A.

NEW YORK — (AP) — Mrs. John F. Kennedy left her Fifth Avenue apartment this afternoon for a flight to Los Angeles, and Secret Service men had to push a path through onlookers, newsmen and photographers.

Many of the spectators had stood in front of the building at 85th Street, for as long as five hours. Some said they had never seen her before.

Some carried radios and were keeping abreast of Senator Kennedy's fight for life in Los Angeles.

She appeared relatively composed when she left her apartment. But when she reached John F. Kennedy International Airport, her composure cracked.

Burke Marshall, vice president and general counsel of International Business Machines (IBM), met and embraced Mrs. Kennedy and she broke into tears. She had to rest her head for several minutes on Marshall's shoulder before she could gain control of herself.

Marshall held Mrs. Kenne-

dy tightly and appeared to be supporting her as they waited for a commercial airliner from London carrying Prince Stanislas Radziwill, another of Mrs. Kennedy's brothers-in-law. Mrs. Kennedy ran up the boarding ramp to meet the Prince and embraced him in tears.

It was Radziwill's wife, Princess Lee Bouvier Radziwill, who telephoned her sister at 4 a.m. from London and told her the tragic news about the Senator.
