

## FBI in Sabotage Search

The FBI and Contra Costa County authorities today took over investigation of the latest Bay Area power line sabotage — the destruction of three big PG&E towers early yesterday.

PG&E meantime posted a \$1000 reward for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the culprits.

The steel structures, toppled by explosives shortly before 5 a.m., were in the East Bay Hills in Contra Costa County, a few feet east of the Alameda County line.

As they fell they tore down six 115,000 volt transmission lines, blacking out 30,000 homes for periods up to several hours. Altogether an estimated 300,000 customers suffered momentary flickering or "dips" in power.

No clues to the saboteurs exist.

## Low Income Vote to RFK

Sen. Robert F. Kennedy polled about 70 percent of the vote in California low income areas, according to a National Broadcasting Company analysis.

NBC also credited him with 75 percent in Negro communities and more than 85 percent Mexican-American precincts.

Sen. Eugene McCarthy was running about 5 percentage points ahead of Kennedy in

middle income districts.

In high income areas, both candidates and the uncommitted slate headed by Atty. Gen. Thomas C. Lynch were running about even.
