Gun Once

The gun used to cut down Sénator Kennedy was traced today to a Marin County housewife who said she in turn gave it to a young man in Pasadena.

Mrs. Dana Westlake of Woodacre said she was given a .22 caliber pistol by her fa-ther in 1965. She told Marin County sheriff's deputies she gave the gun to 18 year old Charles (Chick) Erhardt of Pasadena sometime in late November or early December of last year.

Mrs. Westlake described Erhardt as a family friend, "a nice quiet boy from a good family."

CHECK REPORT

The Pasadena Police Department was checking on the report but said it had no record of anyone by that name in its files.

The Marin Sheriff's Office received a phone call from a Los Angeles detective at 4:25 a.m. He said the gun used in the assesination attempt had been traced to an Alahambra man. The detective asked the department to check with Mrs. Westlake.

GIFT TO HER

A deputy was immediately dispatched to Mrs. Westlake's home. He said she told him that her father, Albert L. Hurt, had purchased the gun at about the time of the Watts riots.
