TRIBUTE TO RFK MEMORY

Cancel Baseball Games Saturday

Scheduled major league baseball games in Washington, New York and Chicago Saturday will be postponed but other games will be played after the funeral of the assassinated Sen. Robert F. Kennedy, Commissioner William D. Eckert said today.

All teams will be permitted to play on Sunday, following appropriate ceremonies honoring the memory of the aspirant for the Democratic nomina-tion for the presidency who died early today in Los Angeles. Sen. Kennedy was shot in the head early Wednesday in a Los Angeles hotel.

Eckert released the following statement:

"ALL of us in baseball are shocked and sorrowed by the tragic death of Sen. Robert F. Kennedy. Our deepest sympathy goes to the members of the Kennedy family.

"In respectful tribute to Sen. Kennedy, I am directing all major league games of Saturday, June 8, with the ex-ception of New York and

Washington, will not start until after the funeral.

"There will be no games Saturday in New York and Washington.

"In addition, an appropriate tribute will be paid to the senator by our clubs prior to or during the games of Sunday, June 9." * *

THE original schedule for Saturday called for four day g a m e s in the American League and one night game and three day games in the National and two night games, including a twinight doubleheader.

Apparently, some of the day games that would conflict with the funeral will be shifted to night games.

Chuvalo Retains Canadian Crown
