

5 Wounded Rally In RFK Shooting

LOS ANGELES — (UPI) — Four persons wounded in the gunplay that attended the assassination of Sen. Robert Kennedy were making satisfactory progress in Los Angeles area hospitals today.

A fifth was discharged. He is Ira Goldstein, 19, a newsman from Encino, who suffered a bullet wound in the left thigh. A spokesman at Encino Hospital said Goldstein would have to get around with a cane temporarily.

Reported improving in the intensive care ward at Kaiser Foundation Hospital was Paul Schrade, 43, western regional director of the United Auto Workers Union.

Surgeons removed bullet fragments from his skull during a two hour operation

Wednesday. Schrade, a member of the Kennedy delegation to the Democratic National Convention, suffered a skull fracture, but the bullet did not penetrate his brain.

Also progressing satisfactorily at the same hospital was William Weisel, 30, an ABC news executive from Washington, D.C., who had a bullet removed from his abdomen.

Mrs. Elizabeth Evans of Saugus (Los Angeles County), was reported "doing very well" by a spokesman at Huntington Memorial Hospital in Pasadena. She was being treated for a scalp wound.

Irwin Stroll, 17, Los Angeles, was in "good" condition at Midway Hospital. He received a bullet wound in the lower left leg.
