

3 Wounded Remain in Hospitals

LOS ANGELES — (UPI) — Three persons wounded in the gunplay that attended the assassination of Sen. Robert Kennedy were making satisfactory progress in Los Angeles area hospitals today.

Two were discharged.

The Ira Goldstein, 19, a newsman from Encino, who suffered a bullet wound in the left thigh, and Irwin Stroll, 17, Los Angeles, who received a bullet in the lower left leg.

Reported improving in the intensive care ward at Kaiser Foundation Hospital was Paul Schrade, 43, western regional director of the United Auto Workers Union.

Surgeons removed bullet fragments from his skull during a two hour operation Wednesday.

Also progressing satisfactorily at the same hospital was William Weisel, 30, an ABC news executive from Washington, D.C., who had a bullet removed from his abdomen.

Mrs. Elizabeth Evans of Saugus (Los Angeles County), was reported "doing very well" by a spokesman at Huntington Memorial Hospital in Pasadena. She was being treated for a scalp wound.
