Jordanians Disavow The Shooting

A Jordanian embassy spokesman yesterday voiced shock at the shooting of Senator Robert F. Kennedy and disavowed any Jordanian government link with what he termed this "criminal act."

An embassy statement said "we deeply regret that the suspect appears to be someone of Jordanian origin who is a permanent resident of the United States."

The suspect was identified as Sirhan B. Sirhan, 24, was born in Jordan and immigrated to the United States in 1957.

The embassy statement said King Hussein has "conveyed his sense of shock and best wishes" to the Kennedy family.
