

Judge Orders Silence

LOS ANGELES — (UPI) — The presiding judge at the arraignment of Sirhan B. Sirhan yesterday issued a sweeping, 800-word order strictly limiting the public statements by lawyers, police, public officials and witnesses to the assassination of Sen. Robert Kennedy.

"This court now has jurisdiction over all proceedings in this case for the first time," Judge Arthur L. Alarcon said, noting that "under our Constitution, each defendant is entitled to the due process of the law and a fair trial."

Alarcon prohibited out of court comments by defense and prosecution lawyers, police officials, sheriff's deputies, grand jurors, witnesses who appeared before the grand jury and "any persons subpoenaed to testify at the trial of this matter."
