

Little Excitement in Illinois Primary

CHICAGO — (AP) — Most political leaders foresee a light turnout of voters in tomorrow's Illinois primary — less than half of the 5.4 million registered.

Voters will nominate candidates for governor, U.S. senator, secretary of state, attorney general, lieutenant governor, state auditor and supreme court clerk.

They also will choose nominees for Congress, the Illinois house and two state senate districts besides electing 48 national convention delegates each from the Democratic and Republican party.

At state conventions late this month, Democrats will select 70 more and Republicans 10 national convention delegates.

Richard B. Ogilvie and John Henry Altorfer are making the strongest claims of victory in the four-way race for the GOP gubernatorial nomination.

The other two are former Gov. William G. Stratton and S. Thomas Sutton.

In addition to governor, Republicans have contests for secretary of state, auditor and supreme court clerk. No Democrat is opposed in a state race.
