

1 HURTWITH KENNEDY REMAIN IN HOSPITAL

LOS ANGELES, June 11 (UPI) —Only one of the five persons wounded in the gunplay that attended the assassination of Senator Robert F. Kennedy remains in the hospital a week after the shooting occurred.

Paul Schrade, 43 years old, western regional director of the United Auto Workers union, is undergoing treatment at Kaiser Foundation Hospital for a depressed skull fracture.

Mr. Schrade told a news conference Monday that he never saw the man who fired at Senator Kennedy early last Wednesday morning.

"I didn't see the gunman," Mr. Schrade said. "There could have been one or there could have been ten."

The union official said that while he was only six feet from the Senator he did not see him fall.

He said he had not watched television or read newspapers since he was wounded, and did not know the name of the suspect in custody—Sirhan B. Sirhan, a 24-year-old Jordanian immigrant from Pasadena, Calif.
