

Sirhan Due In Court Tomorrow

Sirhan Sirhan, the Jordanian immigrant suspected of shooting a fatal bullet into the brain of Senator Robert F. Kennedy, has his next day in court tomorrow.

Sirhan, 24, is scheduled to enter a plea to charges he killed the New York Democratic presidential candidate and wounded five other persons.

But there was speculation that instead his newly appointed attorney would seek a continuance to study the county grand jury transcript.

It also was believed that the attorney, Russell E. Parsons, would seek appointment of a second psychiatrist to examine Sirhan.

The Superior Court earlier appointed two psychiatrists to interview the defendant in County Jail, but one of them, Dr. Edward Stainbrook, declined.

The other psychiatrist, Dr. Eric Marcus, already has examined Sirhan. The results of the examination — available only to the defense — would be used by Parsons to help determine what plea Sirhan should enter to the charges against him.

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
