

Trial Is Set for Man Seized With Gun at Kennedy Rite

A Criminal Court judge ordered a Syracuse businessman Tuesday to stand trial on a charge of possession of an unloaded revolver at the funeral of Senator Robert F. Kennedy on June 8 at St. Patrick's Cathedral.

Judge William S. Shea rejected the contention of Gary R. De Dell, a 30-year-old printing firm salesman, that the charge should be dismissed because he had voluntarily surrendered the .38 caliber weapon to a policeman. He ruled that this was "a matter of defense to be shown by the defendant upon a trial."
