His office, in announcing the veto today, released a statement in which he said the measure "is so broadly worded that it would have the unintended effect of impending the legitimate use of autopsy photographs in medical education and research."

The measure, by Assemblyman James Bear, (D-San Diego), bans the copying of any photograph of a body taken during the post mor-tem examinations unless for use in court cases or except by court order.

While the measure didn't mention Kennedy by name, sponsors said it was aimed at preventing reproduction of the autopsy photos of the New York senator, who was assassinated in Los Angeles the night of the June prima-
