

Man Convicted of Carrying Pistol at Kennedy Funeral

A 30-year-old Syracuse businessman was convicted Tuesday of illegally carrying a pistol to the funeral of Senator Robert F. Kennedy at St. Patrick's Cathedral last June 8.

Gary Dedell, a vice president and salesman for the Kaufman-Dedell Printing Service, was arrested when the police stopped him outside the cathedral and found the pistol, unloaded, in his briefcase.

At his trial in Criminal Court here, Dedell testified that he had been looking for a policeman so that he could surrender the weapon.

Sentencing was set for Nov.

13. Dedell faces a maximum penalty of one year's imprisonment plus a \$1,000 fine.
