perjury charge stems from testimony given by Stuart in Civil Service Commission hearings on the dismissal of Noguchi in 1969 since Stuart claimed himself to be an expert medical witness.

Stuart testified against Noguchi, describing him as University of London earned to practice medicine despite unstable. But Noguchi was

reinstated.

Mayer said an investiga-tion which is not yet com-plete also makes it "appear that Stuart did practice medicine" as an anesthesiologist in Chicago, Freeport, Bahamas, and in Florida without a license.

Records also show that he served on the staff of the Buffalo (N.Y.) General Hospital from 1954 to 1957,
