Papers of Robert Kennedy Are Opened to the Public

Are Opened to the Public

WALTHAM, Mass., Feb. 27

(AP)—The first group of papers of the late Senator Robert F. Kennedy, including those from his term as United States Attorney General, have been opened to the public by the administrators of the John F. Kennedy Librray.

The papers of the late President and some of his associates are being housed temporarily at the Federal Records Center here. The Presidential library, planned for Cambridge, is not scheduled to open until 1977.

The General Services Administration, which now has charge of the papers, said that some 10,000 documents from the personal files of Robert Kennedy would be opened for research.
