Police said they picked up the hitch-hiker on U. S. 71 in Joplin on a tip by a woman at a motel. He told police he had been in Springfield, Mo., and was trying to hitch a ride to Tulsa, Okla. The man identified himself as Lynn R. Cleveland, 35, a Baptist evangelist from St. Louis, and said he was a native of Palmer,

Tex.

Police said he carried several religious pamphlets from Ozark,
Ala., Harrison, Ark., and Memphis. Police in Memphis said they
did not know oof the man and had no hold order for him. St. Louis
police said he had no record there.
