## Ray Search Turns To Australia

CANBERRA, Australia (AP)—Australian police are making a nationwide search for James Earl Ray, wanted in the United States on a charge of killing Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

Police officials said the U.S. Federal Bureau of Investigation cabled that it had information indicating Ray, also known as Eric Starvo Galt, might have fled to Australia.

Australian police have also begun an intensive examination of all entry documents filed at points of entry since King's assassination, but officers say nothing positive has turned up yet.

The Australian embassy in Washington said it was making a routine check to determine whether an application for an entry permit to Australia had been filed by Ray. An embassy official said it acted at the request of the FBI.
