Copies of affidavits, state laws and prison records accompanied a letter from Hearnes to Secretary of State Dean Rusk. The governor said he hoped the documents would speed the return of Ray to the United States.

Hearnes indicated he had consulted with U.S. government officials, but could say nothing further.

Ray was captured in London Saturday.
