Ray's Brother Plans Trip To London to See Suspect

To London to See Suspect

ST. LOUIS, June 14 (AP)—
A brother of James Earl Ray, the accused killer of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., said today he would apply Monday for a passport so he could visit the suspect in London. The brother, John Larry Ray, 35 years old, also said he was attempting to reach Percy Foreman, the trial lawyer, to ask him to represent his brother.

In Houston, Mr. Foreman said that he received a call yesterday from St. Louis, presumably from John Larry Ray or someone representing him, but that hee was out of the office at the time.

Mr. Foreman said he would "deal only with James Earl Ray himself and not with anyone else."
