The Hunstville newspaper quoted a source close to the case as saying the guilty plea "is the only way Ray can espace the death sentence" and win a 99-year term.

The Times said its source reported that such a sentence would have to be imposed by the jury. However, plans are for the jury to be empaneled and each juror will be asked if he would abide by the recommendation of the court.
