Statement of Plot Disowned by Ray

James Earl Ray has disowned a statement that federal agents killed Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. and framed him as the assassin.

The statement was attributed to Ray, serving 99 years for the slaying, by his brother Jerry Ray of Chicago. The prisoner's lawyer, Robert W.

Ray, who pleaded guilty, is seeking a trial by jury, claiming his civil rights were violated in previous court proceedings.
