James Earl Ray 'Names Others'

A local television station quoted "highly placed sources" last night revealing that James Earl Ray has completed a document in which he names several persons he claims were involved in a conspiracy to assassinate Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

WSM-TV said the source said Ray's statement was attached to a writ mailed to the U.S. District Court here Saturday naming persons he claimed gave him money to participate in a conspiracy.
