CBS Seeks Ballistic Data On the Slaying of Dr. King

MEMPHIS, Sept. 24 (UPI)—CBS, Inc. has requested access to ballistics evidence in the 1968 slaying of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. and a hearing has been scheduled Friday on the petition.

A Memphis attorney, Newton P. Allen, representing the network, asked the court to let CBS newsmen and experts examine a 30.06 rifle, a cartridge case, a slug, a cartridge box and a windowsill now in court custody.

Mr. Allen contends that a CBS program on the King as sassination and others, scheduled for television broadcast Nov. 30, could "have a bearing on the important question of the existence of a conspiracy which is also of continuing public interest."
