The Democratic whip, Robert C. Byrd of West Virginai, urged the Senate intelligence committee to conduct a "through review" of the original F.B.I. investigation of Dr. King's death. Representative Phillip Burton, Democrat of California, said that the House Judiciary Committee should conduct an investigation because of the "shocking and confirmed" disclosure that the F.B.I. had attempted to discredit Dr. King. Mr. Burton is chairman of the House Democratic Caucus.

Attorney General Edward H. Levi last week ordered a Justice Department review of the bureau's investigation, which concluded that James Earl Ray was the lone assassin of Dr. King.
