

G.O.P. AIDES TO MEET TO PLAN CONVENTION

WASHINGTON, April 15—Planners of the Republican nominating convention in San Diego will meet early next week with members of President Nixon's staff to discuss arrangements for the convention that is scheduled to open Aug. 21.

The meeting was arranged amid reports that the committee arranging the convention had encountered labor and other difficulties and that Robert F. Knowles, coordinator of the 1972 convention, had suggested that the party give serious consideration to moving the convention to another city.

Party officials here said there was no intention at this time to relocate the convention. They said that the White House meeting was scheduled as a matter of routine to acquaint the White House with the problems encountered in San Diego.
