

# Miami Beach Agency Cuts Pledge to the G.O.P.

MIAMI BEACH, April 25 — The Miami Beach Tourist Development Authority voted today to offer the Republican party a minimum of \$100,000 to help underwrite the G.O.P. National Convention in August if it is held here.

The authority had earlier made a \$250,000 cash pledge. The reduction was voted after Mayor Chuck Hall said at the authority meeting that the \$100,000 offer, which could be increased by money from other sources, was a reasonable one.

An official invitation by the City Council to the Republican party to hold its convention here is expected later this week. Jesse Weiss, a member of the development authority, said, "I'm sure that a reasonable agreement will be reached."

### Buick Agrees to Move

DETROIT, April 25—The Buick division of the General Motors Corporation announced today that it would move its convention of dealers from Miami Beach, removing a major obstacle to switching the Re-

publican convention to Miami Beach from San Diego.

Miami Beach officials, who want the Republican convention in their city, had indicated that the Republicans would have to begin their convention Aug. 14 instead of Aug. 21 so as not to conflict with the convention of 4,000 Buick dealers.

R. L. Herman, vice chairman of the Republican committee on arrangements, has said that the party is actively seeking a bid from Miami Beach because San Diego was having difficulties in meeting its commitments.
