

KLEINDIENST DISPUTE DELAYS SHULTZ VOTE

WASHINGTON, May 30 (UPI)

—The Senate's confirmation of George P. Shultz as Treasury Secretary became snarled today in a still pending controversy over Richard G. Kleindienst's nomination as Attorney General.

Senate republicans asked that the Senate delay acting on Mr. Shultz's nomination until it had disposed of Mr. Kleindienst's appointment.

"We don't want the Shultz nomination to be used as an excuse for any delaying tactics [on Kleindienst]," senator Hugh Scott of Pennsylvania, the Senate republican leader, said.

Mr. Kleindienst's nomination has been held up by a dispute over the role he and other Justice Department officials played in a decision last year to drop antitrust suits against the International Telephone and Telegraph Corporation.

The Senate Democratic leader, Mike Mansfield of Montana, said the Senate would begin debate on the Kleindienst nomination as soon as it completed work—probably this week—on a State Department money authorization bill.
