## Why Oswald Shot President McKinley

HATS OFF TODAY to the John Birch Society for finally figuring out why Mr. Kennedy was shot. It wasn't easy. Not for the Society, it wasn't.

Of course, the Birchers knew all along that "the vast Communist conspiracy" was responsible. But it also knew all along that Mr. Kennedy was the most valuable secret agent the conspiracy had. He then staged a fake invasion of Cuba in order to let Colonel Teddy Roosevelt make a name for himself. And what name did the Colonel make for himself? Roosevelt! This painstaking plot paid off 34 years later with the election of President F. D. Roosevelt, who faked World War II in order to sell out at Yalta. Which made him the greatest Communist President we ever had. Until Mr. Eisenhower took office.

So much for historical fact. Unfortunately, we can only conjecture why Mr. McKinley suddenly decided to turn American in 1901. Perhaps he grew to like baseball. Or apple pie. Perhaps he wanted a passport. But there's no question he made such a decision. For he was assassinated by a left-winger named Leon Czolgosz. Who was known as "Lee Oswald" to many people with speech defects. And the very fact that Mr. McKinley was shot proves, of course, that he secretly planned to turn American.
