WASHINGTON, NOV. 7 (AP)-HAROLD BAREFOOT SANDERS, 41, WAS SWORN IN TODAY AS ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL IN CHARGE OF THE JUSTICE DEPARTMENT'S CIVIL DIVISION.

SANDERS, A TEXAN, AS SWORN IN BY ACTING ATTY. GEN. RAMSEY CLARK, A FELLOW TEXAN.

AFTER THE SWEARING IN, CLARK SAID OF SANDERS "FOLKS DOWN IN TEXAS HAVE KNOWN SINCE 1936 HE WAS GOING TO DO GREAT THINGS, BECAUSE IN THAT YEAR HE WAS CHOSEN FRECKLE CHAMPION OF THE STATE FAIR."

SANDERS, A FORMER TEXAS STATE REPRESENTATIVE AND U.S. ATTORNEY FOR THE 100-COUNTY NORTHERN DISTRICT OF TEXAS, WAS APPOINTED ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL SEPT. 16 BY PRESIDENT JOHNSON.

A UNIVERSITY OF TEXAS GRADUATE AND WORLD WAR II NAVY OFFICER, SANDERS JOINED THE JUSTICE DEPARTMENT IN FEBRUARY 1965 AS AN ASSISTANT DEPUTY ATTORNEY GENERAL. HE HAD DIRECTED THE PRESIDENTIAL CAMPAIGN OF JOHN F. KENNEDY IN 1960 FOR THE DALLAS COUNTY AREA.
