

Joe Dolan call-in program, KNEW, Oakland.

Robert Kafike is caller, identified by reference to CE 2121, XXIV, 649. Also by his statement on program, "I am currently at the SF State College experimental workshop on the Kennedy assassination... My own particular research assignment is on Oswald's trip to Mexico."

Caller: ... I was present at that time and in that compound and I was talking to the Cuban Consul, Senor Asque (who has since been replaced), and I believe that I have a slight resemblance to Oswald, and that this would /unintelligible/ in identifying me, although he swears it was Oswald. The important point is that this was at a time that Oswald was supposedly there, but I didn't see him. I have never been interviewed regarding this by the FBI or the CIA, that I know of.

Dolan: Do they know that you were there?

Caller: In the Warren volumes, in the same Commission Exhibit, 2121 /and/ in a later page concerning speculations and rumors regarding Oswald's trip in Mexico -

Dolan: What does it say about you?

Caller: Well, it says merely - it doesn't mention the fact that I was in the embassy, which I would think was important, it - this was an interview with the embassy. I went to the embassy because I thought my life was in danger, and I told them why I thought it was: that I had been in the embassy, that I had been kicked out, and my room searched, and I'd been followed and a knife put at my throat, etc.

Dolan: Is this in Cuba?

Caller: No, in Mexico City.

Dolan: In Mexico City.

Caller: Yes, this was in February of 1964. I went back to do research on Oswald, I found out where he stayed - the Comercio Hotel - and I went around enquiring, you know. But this time I thought my life was in danger and went to the American embassy, to the protection and welfare office, and that is an interview carried in this commission exhibit, 2121. However, it doesn't mention the fact that I was in the Cuban embassy; it doesn't mention the fact that my life was in danger; it mentions something to the effect that I had talked to Mark Lane and that I was sceptical of the FBI reports and sceptical that Oswald might have done it. So what I am implying is that they left out the important part, the fact that I was in that embassy supposedly at the same - it's very interesting why they left it out, because my /witnessed?/ report was contradictory to what they wanted. I assume that is why they left it out.
