

**JOHN KENNEDY CITED  
AS NO. 1 HERO IN POLL**

CINCINNATI (UPI)—A poll of 325 graduates of 15 Roman Catholic colleges who were asked to list their most admired heroes ranked Jesus Christ fifth.

Tom Schick, assistant editor of the St. Anthony Messenger, a monthly magazine of the Franciscan order that published the poll, said the late President John F. Kennedy was ranked first.

Mr. Schick asserted that Kennedy was followed on the

list by his brother, Robert, the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King and Pope John XXIII.

Mr. Schick wrote that the selection of Jesus was "somewhat of a surprise since this response was not really envisioned and the survey's directions oriented the respondents to other heroes."

None of the present leaders of the Roman Catholic Church were listed among the top 20 in the poll, Mr. Schick asserted, although Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen of Rochester was prominently mentioned.

Ranked sixth was Senator Eugene J. McCarthy, Democrat of Minnesota, followed by Bob

Hope, Sir Winston Churchill, Dr. Tom Dooley, with Mohandas K. Ghandi and President Nixon in a 10th-place tie.

Mr. Schick confided that the most commonly given reason for selections were: "He worked for others," "he cared," or "he was dedicated to a cause."
