

Cuban Reported Executed After Raid on Army Post

MIAMI, Dec. 5 (AP) — The Havana radio reported today that a Cuban firing squad had executed a man who had taken part in a raid on a military post and had killed a Government official in an unsuccessful attempt to flee the country.

The man, Alberto Alfredo Mustelier, was said to have been executed last night under orders from the Havana Revolutionary Tribunal. He was re-

ported to have been one of three men who raided a military base in Pinar del Rio Province in October in an attempt to steal a launch. The radio report made no mention of the sentences imposed on Mr. Mustelier's companions.

4 EXECUTED IN CUBA AS U.S. INFILTRATORS

MIAMI, Dec. 7—The Cuban Government announced today that four Cuban exiles, described as "infiltrators" from the United States, had been executed by a firing squad.

The announcement, broadcast by the Havana radio, said that the four—Amancio Mosqueda Fernandez, Angel Luis Castillo Cabrera, Francisco Cid Crespo and Manuel Rodriguez Pineda—had been part of a group of "10 enemy agents who, coming from the United States, infiltrated" Cuba last May 3 near Guantanamo in Oriente Province.

It added that a revolutionary tribunal in Santiago de Cuba, which ordered death sentences for the four, gave 20-year prison sentences to three other members of the group.

The Havana radio said that the seven had been arrested shortly after landing in Cuba, following a clash with military forces in which the remaining three exile infiltrators were killed.

The group had "instructions to sabotage economic installations" in Oriente, the announcement said. It added that the death sentences were carried out last night in Santiago de Cuba.
