

ANTI-CASTRO GROUP GETS U.S. WARNING

WASHINGTON, May 12 (AP) —The State Department publicly warned a Miami-based anti-Castro group today that it risked prosecution if it used United States territory to launch a strike against Cuba.

Robert J. McCloskey, State Department spokesman, referred specifically to a contention by the Alpha 66 organization that it had sunk two Cuban fishing boats in Cuban waters and was holding 11 Cuban citizens at an undisclosed place outside the United States.

The spokesman said he did not know whether the report was based on fact. But he added:

"The Government of the United States wishes to remind all persons who reside in its territory that United States laws forbid the use of United States territory as a base for any military expedition against a foreign country."
