From story by Douglas E. Kneeland on refugees from South Vietnam, filed Indochina:

"Since the early nineteen-sixties, about 675,000 anti-Castro Cubans have ... been resettled in the United States..., 11,600 of them ... last year."

See story on "parole" status of such refugees, as described in a section of the Immigration and Nationality Act of 1952. Story says that "Congress has passed special laws to allow both the Hungarian and Cuban refugees to 'adjust their status' by applying for residence as permanent aliens."
